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I. A Letter from our President

Welcome to GlobaL/REAP, School of Discipleship, a partnership between Global University and REAP International (Roever Educational Assistance Programs International). This school exists to provide spiritual discipleship for effective ministry.

The biblical admonition, - "study to show thyself approved," - should be taken as more than a suggestion. I take it as a commandment. There is nothing darker than ignorance and nothing more enlightening than knowledge.

II. Global/REAP Focus

As a school of discipleship, our primary focus is twofold:

- 1. To always keep evangelism at the heart of everything we do, because, there must be converts to disciple in order to "make disciples."
- 2. To recognize the biblical mandate for the "five-fold ministry" paradigm of Ephesians 4.

Ephesians 4:11-12 And He gave some *as* apostles, and some *as* prophets, and some *as* evangelists, and some *as* pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ...

The ministry gifts to the church are FOR the EQUIPPING of the saints

FOR the WORK OF SERVICE

TO build up the Church – Christ's Body

We are not actually looking for students; we are looking for trainers, disciplers and teachers. For too long making converts has been an end in itself. Because of this, the Christ's Body has suffered. The partnership between Global University and REAP International seeks to end the bottleneck.

We see the church as the manifestation of the Kingdom of God on the Earth. Therefore, we refuse to be deterred by denominational biases or language barriers. **The mandate is to "Make disciples of all nations."**

Why Global/REAP REAP? The Global/REAP model has proved its effectiveness in Vietnam to an astonishing degree. Beginning just a few years ago with a small group of about twenty students, the School of Discipleship has grown to about 120,000 students worldwide today. There are teaching centers in about 36 countries and they are spreading rapidly. We are convinced that this is the time and this is the tool God has chosen to change the world through the Gospel of Jesus Christ, freely delivered through multiple media, and discipled disciplers multiplying exponentially!

The Great Commission in Matthew's Gospel is: Go and make disciples of all nations. For far too long the Body of Christ has been more about making converts than making disciples. Making a convert without follow-up discipleship is like having a baby and leaving it to

fend for itself without nurture. This lack of discipleship has resulted in Christ's Body filled with undiscipled Christians.

Global/REAP exists to provide a solution to this problem. The Ephesians 4 program is simple: Apostles, Prophets, Evangelists, Pastors and Teachers exist to equip, train, teach - Equippers, Trainers, and Teachers.

Whatever a person's calling may be, it can never mature beyond his or her knowledge and understanding of the Word of God. The material as we provide it – internet, printed and verbally – will prepare the students for continued education and service.

III. Global/REAP Program Elements

The Global/REAP Discipleship Program offers discipleship training for everyone. The discipleship programs are designed to help new believers follow Jesus according to a solid biblical foundation. Also included is a deeper level of discipleship which trains Christian leaders to serve in their homes, churches, and communities. Many of the courses are available in over 130 languages.

<u>Continuing Education Credit</u>*_Global University does not award college credit equivalents. Instead, SED courses can provide students with Continuing Education Units (CEU). Students officially enrolled with Global/REAP may login to their student account to print a subject list and unofficial transcript.

<u>Program Delivery</u> The program is designed to be delivered in both a web based and a traditional instructor, face-to-face format.

Web Based Students: Web based students have access to the full textbook, as well as the lessons, unit and final exam. All classes include electronic exams. Electronic exams provide immediate feedback to the student.

Traditional Students: In the event a class/student does not have access to the internet and needs a printed textbook, Global/REAP will coordinate with a local certified instructor. Textbook fees may apply. A printed exam must be proctored by a Global/REAP Certified Proctor. Proctored groups will receive their final grades via email or mail. Global/REAP will post his/her grade in the electronic system and their permanent record. An unofficial transcript from the Global System is available upon request.

Unofficial Student Status: In some instances official enrollment will not be applicable therefore limited assistance may be provided to establish an unofficial Study Group. The method does NOT provide a transcript, certificate, or diploma from Global University. It also does not provide any adult continuing education transfer credits towards future programs. It is for personal enrichment only. No application or enrollment with Global/REAP is required. Resources may be available for the study group. Students will NOT have access to the online course materials or exams. This delivery method requires Executive Vice President approval. Student Study Guides: Student guides are available at no charge as downloadable PDF files. If printed documents are needed from Global/REAP, the documents will be provided at the then current fee plus shipping cost. Contact Global/REAP for more information.

<u>Certificates</u> will be issued when a student successfully completes the Christian Life Series and when they successfully complete the Christian Service Series. The student will be invited to attend a certificate award luncheon at our corporate office or their local regional office. In the event a student is unable to attend a certificate award luncheon, they may contact Global/REAP for more information and pay the applicable fee to have their certificate mailed to them.

<u>Continuing Education Opportunities:</u> Students are encouraged to continue their Christian biblical studies when they complete the Global/REAP program. For more information contact Global/REAP.

IV. Global University Curriculum

DISCIPLESHIP: Christian Life Series*

Jesus said "everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock" (Matthew 7:24–25). The Christian Life Series is designed to give new believers a solid biblical foundation upon which to begin their life as a Christ follower. The courses will help students grow in their relationship with Christ, interact with the Word of God, and better understand God's purposes for their lives. The series consists of 18 courses centered around six themes: Spiritual Life, The Bible, Theology, The Church, Service, and Christian Ethics. Officially enrolled students who complete all 18 courses including the final examinations may be eligible to receive a Christian Life Certificate. For officially enrolled students only.

CL1110 Book 1: Your New Life (Spiritual Life)
